Updates on New Civil Rights and Reproductive Health Privacy Regulations

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office for Civil Rights (OCR)- Eastern & Caribbean Region, invites you to a virtual briefing on updates to civil rights, reproductive health privacy laws.

This briefing is designed to help educate and inform providers, advocates, and the public about three recent final rules issued by HHS OCR: HIPAA Privacy Rule to Support Reproductive Health Care Privacy, which prohibits the disclosure of protected health information related to lawful reproductive health care in certain circumstances. Section 1557 of the Affordable Care Act, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, disability, or sex in covered health programs or activities. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in HHS-funded health and human services.

These rules help protect YOUR health information privacy and civil rights in health care and human services and OCR is committed to ensuring that all
